Kindergarten

Our Kindergarten program is designed to encourage students to explore their world by asking good questions that lead to rich understanding.

Kindergarten at Faith Christian School builds on the early foundation laid in Junior Kindergarten to encourage students to observe and explore by asking good questions that lead to discovering what is good, true, and beautiful.

Kindergarteners At FCS Will:

- Build strong relationships with their teachers. With a low teacher to student ratio, Kindergarten students are able to spend one-on-one time with teachers to receive the individual attention they need.
- Explore God's creation, developing observation skills and logic.
- Have their young faith nurtured by loving teachers who know them by name and integrate a biblical worldview into all of their earliest lessons
- Experience the joy of learning to read that sets a foundation for years of joy to come
- Explore mathematics in concrete, fun, hands-on lessons to build strong number sense and an excellent foundation for more advanced mathematics in the years to come.

As A Kindergarten Parent, You Can Expect:

Alignment With Your Family Values
Our students come from over 80 different church communities and Christian denominations, but all of our teachers model what it means to live out the Gospel and infuse those values into a Christian education that supports everything you're teaching them at home.

Individual Attention For Your Child Our Kindergarten class provides an environment where students flourish alongside teachers and peers who truly know and love them.

Along with a low teacher to student ratio, a purposeful schedule is designed so students receive individual attention from teachers in order to provide support as needed for students to grow in foundational skills such as reading and math.

KINDERGARTEN PARTICULARS

- Kindergarten students have a snack, lunch, and quiet time each day, along with two recess periods. The afternoon quiet time is a time for students to complete unfinished work, engage in crafts or games that correspond with learning, and enjoy stories read by their teacher.
- Many supplies are provided by the school but a list of supplies to be purchased will be provided prior to first day of school.
- Uniforms are required. For more information visit the New Families section of fcsva.com.

 - The focus in Kindergarten is on learning and growth rather than grades, so a typical grading scale is not used. A report card will contain a narrative from the teacher highlighting the skills the students are learning and mastering.
 - Students attend a weekly, age-appropriate chapel, interacting with lower school students as they pray, sing, and listen to a theme-based lesson.
 - Students work as a class to memorize scriptures and questions/answers from the New City (Children's) Catechism.



- Students practice life-giving principles of the Fruit of the Spirit instead of mere adherence to rules (e.g. loving our neighbors as ourselves or proper conflict resolution) through Peacemakers curriculum.
- Students are prepared for reading by learning letters and phonograms in a fun and meaningful way.
- Students are prepared for math concepts in consecutive lower school grades using Singapore's Dimensions Math, a curriculum designed to provide students with a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts. Singapore Math enables students to learn math concepts in the following ways:

Concrete - manipulatives
Pictorial - using pictures
Abstract - algorithms and problem-solving

- Physical Education and the Arts are considered a core part of the curriculum, providing ever so much more than just a creative outlet.
- Nature Studies gets children outside, observing, exploring, and journaling—all skills they will depend on in later grades.
- Parent-Teacher conference occur at least
 1-2 times per year.

A Day In The Life

Wondering what your child's day will look like in our Kindergarten class? Here's a sample schedule from one of our typical days:

Before Morning Classes - Math Meeting Board

The Math Meeting Board Additionally, this includes counting the days of the school, talking about coins, grouping by tens, and other methods of building math skills. They also practice recitations including weekly scripture.

Morning Classes - Core Subjects

Letter study, Writing, Bible, and Math encompass the core subject areas. Each class actively engages students in purposeful and intentional play and experiential learning that includes critical thinking, problem-solving, and hands-on student-centered activities. You will often find students working with manipulatives on the floor or in flexible seating while learning.

Independent Works

Students will engage in play-based, independent activities including academic skills with numbers and letters, practical-life works which develop fine and gross motor skills, and fun works such as puzzles and games.

Enrichment Classes

Students can often be found conducting science experiments in nature studies, learning and experiencing different cultures in music class. Physical Education classes include a Motor Lab which help students develop motor skills. Enrichment classes serve to add depth to the already robust learning of the day.

Afternoons

Students have a 45 minute rest period in the afternoon, a snack, and additional enrichment or play time.

Foundational Curriculum

The Lower School (K-5th) curriculum taught by loving faculty embraces all of the innate, God-given attributes in children: A desire to discover and learn, endless curiosity, an open heart and mind, and a soul to be gently formed in the image of God. Your child's education at this formative stage should be inviting, fun, nurturing, and encouraging so they will be inspired to become life-long learners.

Core Subject Areas

Great attention is given to language arts and mathematics. Students move from "learning to read" in the primary grades to "reading to learn" in grades 3-5. Great focus is placed on number sense and understanding the "why" and not just the "how" about what they are learning in math to help them have great success in more advanced mathematics in the future.




Enrichment Classes

Students participate in a variety of specialty classes to aid in the formation of a well-rounded child and to nurture their creativity and wonder through exposure to the arts, nature study, and physical education.



Elementary grades build on foundational habits and skills in core disciplines of language arts and math, all while continuing to build lifelong skills such as asking good questions, speaking with confidence, working as a team, being a good friend, and addressing conflict in a biblical manner. Typically Required Skills

- Perform simple 1- to 3-step directions without assistance
- Count to 20
- Recognize the majority of the letters of the alphabet
- · Identify and write their name

Additional Skills

- Manipulate small objects to improve small motor skills for writing/crafts.
- Dress on their own (e.g. tucking in shirts, tying shoes, carrying their own bag).
- Handle their own bathroom needs. Eat independently (minus opening packages, etc.).
- Complete a chore and organize/clean up their spaces.
- Focus for a 5-10-minute period of time while doing a task or listening to a story.
- Make lower-level decisions such as which task to do first.

Fun Things To Do

- Read quality literature to your child every day to increase vocabulary, retention skills, and focus.
- Give your child 1- to 3-step directions to see if they can recall and complete without your help.
- Work on small motor skills to strengthen muscles— this can be done by working with Play-doh, Legos, pencils, crayons, children's scissors, stickers, clothespins, and/or threading toothpicks or pipe cleaners through strainers.
- Assign your child a daily chore. The followthrough will serve as preparation for handling responsibilities in the classroom.
- If possible, take time to play on the school's playground over the summer to increase familiarity and have something to which they can look forward.
- · Work together on age-appropriate puzzles.

The Value Of **Continuity In Elementary School**

FCS elementary students dive deeper into the core academic areas, scaffolding on concepts taught in previous grades.

For example, reading—and learning to love it—starts in Junior Kindergarten with an introduction to letters and all their single-letter phonograms, in fun and meaningful settings. It continues in Kindergarten where students increase their vocabulary, sight-word knowledge, and ability to decode words using an excellent and time-tested phonics program. By first grade, students master all 71 phonograms and are reading independently. In the upper elementary school years, students enjoy reading and discussing quality literature including classics such as Charlotte's Web, The Lion, The Witch, & The Wardrobe, and Dicken's The Christmas Carol.

Additionally, students discover and explore their unique passions through special subjects, service projects, and extracurricular activities. Our teachers ensure they help students to make valuable connections across subject areas and grades.

In math, we follow the time-tested methodology of Singapore Math (concrete, pictoral, abstract) which helps student gain a strong a strong number-sense and build a firm foundation for higher-level mathematics in the future.

To ensure students master a wide variety of skills requires continuity.

Variable Tuition

Faith Christian School proudly offers Variable Tuition to fulfill our commitment to make a private, Christian, classical education affordable to families in the Roanoke area.

Tuition at FCS is not "one-size-fits all." It's a range that spans 45-80% of the actual cost of education. Families pay no more than about 80% of the actual cost of education.

We are able to offset costs through the generosity of our donor base and our financial support programs. Our Variable Tuition adjusts tuition rates to meet your family's unique financial position. Because of the outstanding support of others, no family at FCS pays the full cost of education through tuition.

Variable Tuition allows families to apply for reduced tuition that is affordable for their unique financial situations. Families apply online to an independent third party, FACTS Grant & Aid Management.
